Subject: Implementation and assessment of Revised Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) of 1200 annual learning hours – reg.

Dear Sir/ Madam,

This is regarding, implementation and assessment of restructured & rationalized Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS), for all existing and newly admitted CTS trainees from academic session 2022-23, in reference to letter no. MSDE(DGT)-19/03(04)/2022-CD dated 1st September 2022 (Copy attached).

2. The assessment for the training will be carried out by conducting formative assessments for each Learning Outcome, and final examinations (Summative Assessments) as detailed below:

- i. The formative assessments in respect of each Learning Outcome for practical and related theory are conducted by the concerned instructors for evaluating the knowledge and skill acquired by trainees and the behavioral transformation of the trainees.
- ii. Summative assessment will be carried out by All India Trade Test (AITT) on Trade Theory & Employability Skills and Trade practical. There will be one CBT examination for two hours duration consisting of:
 - a. For Engineering Trades: Trade Theory (including questions on Workshop Calculation & Science and Engineering Drawing) and Employability Skills.
 - b. For Draughtsman Group of Trades: Trade Theory (including questions on Workshop Calculation & Science) and Employability Skills.
 - c. For Non-Engineering Trades: Trade Theory and Employability Skills.

3. The marking pattern and distribution of marks for the trades are as under:



4. The minimum pass percent for Trade Practical and Formative assessment on Learning Outcomes is 60% each. The minimum pass percent in Trade Theory & Employability Skills is 33% each.

5. Directors of States/UTs dealing with ITIs, Regional Director- RDSDEs, and Principals of all ITIs/NSTIs are requested to ensure seamless implementation and assessment of revised CTS trade curriculum in all institutes; and ensure communication of same to all trainers and academic staff.
